Call # 16-11553, Animal Complaint, Dog left in hot vehicle, Summary:

On 07/01/16 at approximately 0935 hours, a complainant who was at the town dock reported a dog was in a hot vehicle. It was determined the vehicle and boat trailer were only left there for a few minutes so the dog's owner was given a warning about the dangers of leaving a dog in a hot vehicle.
